This printable activity book introduces five learning scenes inspired by Sámi landscapes, reindeer-related life, northern travel, fishing, handicrafts, and everyday environments across Sápmi.

Each illustration is inspired by northern nature, practical tools, shelters, animals, crafts, and activities connected with the Sámi-themed scenes featured in this volume.

These pages are designed as respectful starting points for learning. They are not intended to represent every Sámi person or community, suggest that all Sámi people share the same lifestyle, reproduce sacred or culturally restricted imagery, or provide a complete description of Sámi cultures.

Sámi communities are diverse, living, and constantly changing. Sámi people may live in rural areas, towns, or cities and may combine traditional knowledge with modern education, technology, work, art, media, and creative expression.

As you color each page, take time to read the short introduction and explore the related Linglobe article. Every language, landscape, livelihood, and cultural tradition has a deeper story.

How to Use This Book

- Print the pages on A4 paper.
- Use colored pencils, crayons, pens, or markers.
- Read the short cultural introduction on each page.
- Visit Linglobe to learn more about the people and language.
- Use the activity at home, in a classroom, or as part of independent study.

A Note for Families and Educators

We encourage adults and learners to discuss the difference between cultural inspiration and complete cultural representation.

A single illustration cannot explain an entire people or tradition. Use each page as an invitation to ask questions, discover new words, and explore reliable information about the living communities behind the image.

Sámi-inspired Reindeer and Northern Landscape



The Sámi are the Indigenous people of Sápmi, a cultural region extending across northern Norway, Sweden, Finland, and Russia. Sámi communities are diverse, and their cultures include several languages, livelihoods, artistic traditions, and ways of living in northern environments.

Reindeer have an important place in some Sámi communities, particularly in connection with herding, seasonal movement, food, materials, and cultural knowledge. However, not all Sámi people are reindeer herders, and Sámi life also includes fishing, farming, crafts, education, art, business, and urban life.

Look for:

a large reindeer, a smaller reindeer, a lavvu-style tent, a wooden sled, snowy hills, northern trees, and a distant figure.

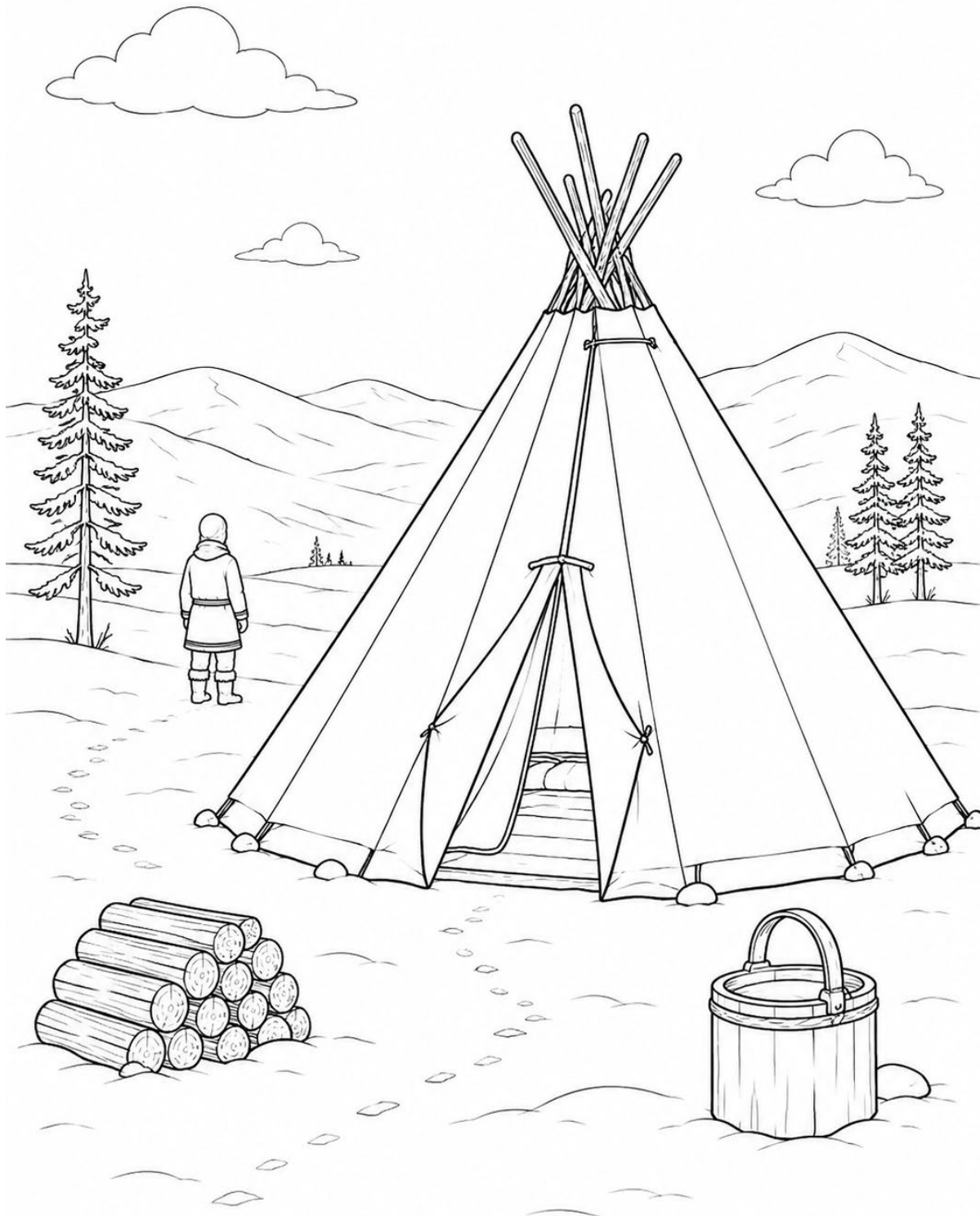
Think About It:

Sámi-inspired Lavvu and Camp Scene



The Sámi are the Indigenous people of Sápmi, a cultural region across northern Norway, Sweden, Finland, and Russia. In some Sámi communities, mobile dwellings such as lavvus were well suited to life in northern environments and seasonal movement.

Look for:

a lavvu tent, northern trees, snowy ground, camp objects, and open land.

Think About It:

How might homes and shelters be designed to fit cold weather and changing seasons?

Sámi-inspired Sled and Winter Travel Scene



Northern regions often require practical ways of moving through snow and cold weather. Sleds and travel tools reflect knowledge of terrain, weather, and seasonal conditions in Arctic and sub-Arctic environments.

Look for:

a wooden sled, snowy ground, travel objects, trees, and distant hills.

Think About It:

Why is it important to adapt travel methods to local weather and land conditions?

Sámi-inspired Northern Fishing Scene



Fishing has been an important part of life in some Sámi communities, alongside many other activities such as farming, herding, hunting, and handicrafts. Lakes, rivers, and coastal waters have supported food, travel, and local knowledge.

Look for:

water, a fishing tool, rocks, trees, a small boat or shoreline, and northern scenery.

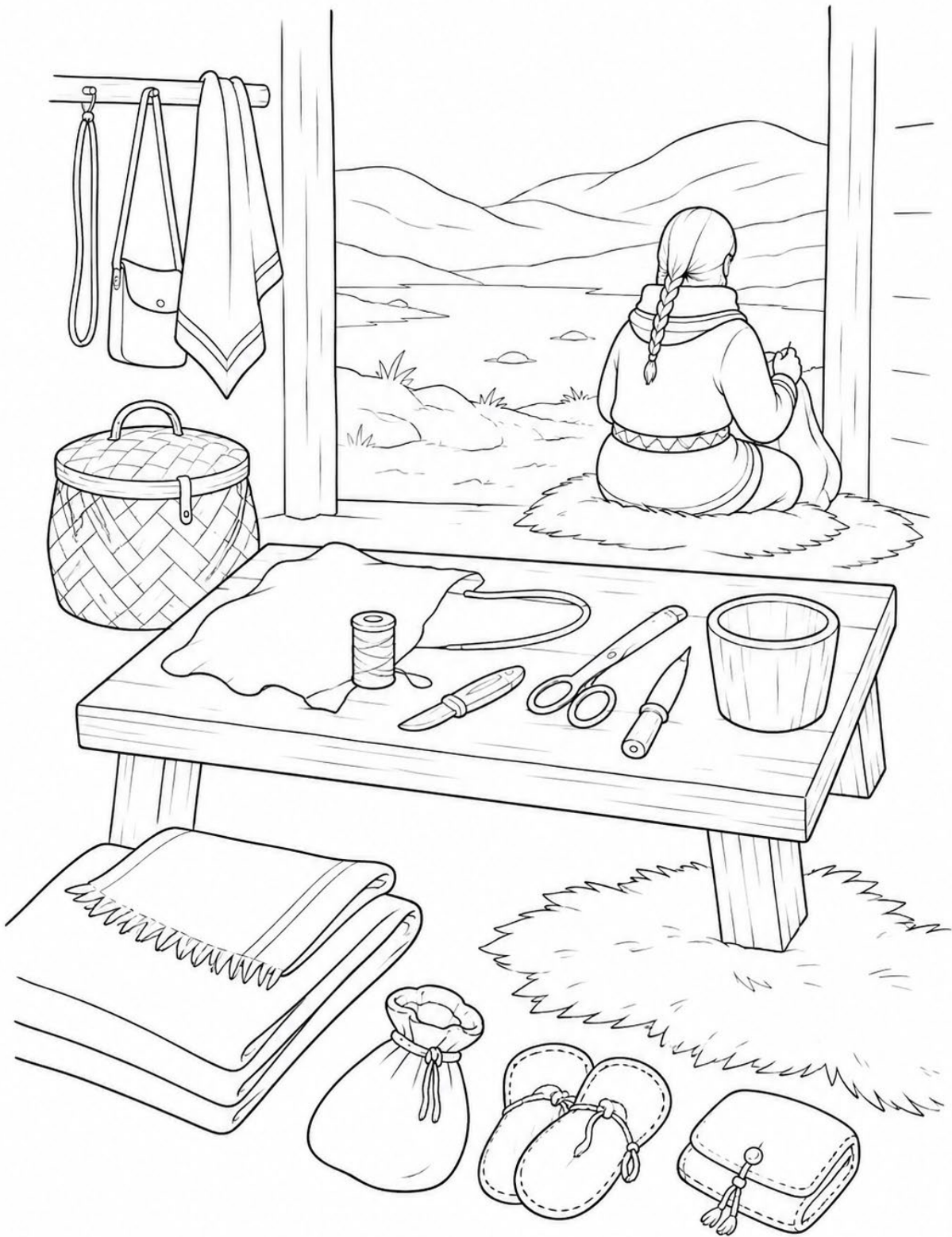
Think About It:

Sámi cultures include rich handicraft traditions, often known as duodji. Handmade objects can reflect practical knowledge, local materials, artistic skill, and the passing of useful traditions between generations.

craft tools, cloth or soft materials, containers, handmade objects, and a simple work area.

How can making everyday objects help preserve knowledge, skill, and cultural identity?
